To whom it may concern:

The following statement relates to the work done by Miss Betty Hulburd as a volunteer in the social agencies in St. Louis.

I interviewed Miss Hulburd in January, 1937, as a prospective volunteer, and she impressed me as an unusually intelligent and capable young woman. I placed her in the Social Service Department of the Washington University Clinics, 507 South Euclid Avenue, where she served as a clinic aide in the surgical clinic three mornings a week. She handled this position quite capably for almost a year.

I placed her, also, in the library service at Barnes Hospital where she served regularly one afternoon a week, distributing books to patients, and assisting with the clerical work. This work also was handled very capably.

The following year I placed Miss Hulburd in a Public Health Center maintained by the Municipal Visiting Nurses of St. Louis, where she served for six months as a clinic aide, making quite satisfactory contacts with patients, and handling the clerical routine very satisfactorily.

Miss Hulburd has been quite helpful in several other instances, in performing such services as taking patients to clinics, and doing emergency clerical work.

In the fall of 1937 Miss Hulburd attended a training course for volunteers in social work given by this Department. She took an intelligent interest in the course, and was faithful in attendance.



And, if you wish to use my name as a reference, please do so!


